


# City News


Watermelon, hot dog and ice cream eating contests will also take place throughout the afternoon. The Liles Hotel and the Artists' Cottages will be open to the public.



Artificial light on the beach can disorient both adult and hatchling sea turtles. The City of Bonita Springs sea turtle protection ordinance requires that sea turtle nesting habitat not be directly or indirectly illuminated by artificial lighting during the nesting season.

May 1 through October 31 - from 9:00pm to 7:00am

## **Project Update**

The City of Bonita Springs Downtown **Project Improvements** has been underway since September 2015. The project is being built in phases that include construction of two to three blocks at a time. When construction is completed, the road segments will be re-opened and construction will move to the next phase. Construction begins with underground utilities installing stormwater drainage and a new gas line. Then the electric and communications lines are installed underneath the Old 41 right-of-way between Tennessee Street to Terry Street. Lastly, crews rebuild the roadway. The final installation of lighting, street furniture, landscaping and some sidewalk reconstruction will occur later in the project when the Florida Power & Light (FPL) underground facilities are put in service and the existing FPL poles are removed.





Phase 1 is Open The first phase of construction along Old 41 from Wilson Street to Childers Street is complete (with the exception of FPL pole removal and final sidewalk construction) and open to traffic. Wilson Street and Reynolds streets are paved and open to traffic. Felts Avenue is also paved between Wilson and Reynolds streets.

Construction on Phase 2 began in February (work occurs concurrently on Felts Avenue and the adjoining side streets). The contractor extended this phase on Old 41 from the Pennsylvania Avenue/Ragsdale Street intersection to include Old 41 south to Hampton Street. Completion of the roadway portion of this phase is expected by mid-summer 2016. Future phases move south on Old 41 Road, with work continuing on the side street, then the next phases of construction will move north of the Imperial River.

After all the phases are complete, FPL poles are removed, light pole bases are installed and sidewalk is completed, the final lift of asphalt will be installed on Old 41 Road. Finally, new signs will be installed and street markings will be added.

The contractor is Wright Construction Group and the project is expected to be complete in fall 2017. The City and the project team are committed to keeping the public informed of construction activities and working with the public to solve any issues that arise during construction. The project website is being updated with new information about construction as it becomes available.



#### **Training Sessions:**

We would like to commend **Jose Duran, IT Manager** & **Kristina Baller, Supervising Accountant** for their efforts in conducting training sessions with staff in May to implement new software.



Jose Duran trained staff on the electronic vendor notification software called eBid. The software allows for electronical vendor notification of bids and proposals. The online system is dedicated to administering formal procurement solicitations (e.g. ITB – Invitation to Bid, RFP - Request for Proposals). You can find the link under the procurement tab on the homepage. Vendors that have previously done work for the city have been notified. Kristina Baller met with and trained the Directors on our recently implemented Finance Software which allows them to enter their budget request along with details that document their requests to support the zero-based budget approach. This consolidates budget preparation and analysis functions in one place, offers a variety of views, comparisons, import tools and easy access to budget reports. This new methodology allows departments to easily drill down into current and prior year actual costs, extract detail information into Excel, access all financial reports in one central locations, ability to add notes (permanent, current and next year) and detail at the line item level. This creates greater transparency in regards to the overall budget process and flexibility for budget requests/changes during the budget process.
