



Lightning Safety is a major concern in Southwest Florida. In 2020, Florida and Texas had the most lightning deaths. Florida is considered the "lightning capital" of the country. This is why it is important to learn how to stay safe in a thunderstorm. The National Weather Service emphasizes some do's and don'ts regarding lightning safety:

- Plan ahead including knowing where you'll go for safety.
- Listen to the forecast. Being outside when lightning is present is not something to take lightly ever.
- Cancel or postpone activities if thunderstorms are in the forecast.
- Take action early so you have time to get to a safe place.
- Get inside a substantial building or hard-topped metal vehicle before threatening weather arrives.
- **Don't forget the 30-30 rule.** After you see lightning, start counting to 30. If you hear thunder before you reach 30, go indoors. Suspend activities for at least 30 minutes after the last clap of thunder.
- Remember: When thunder roars, go indoors.


Lee County COVID-19 Community Impact Survey

COMMITTEE SPOTLIGHT:

TECHNOLOGY ADVISORY BOARD

In July of 2012, City Council determined that a Technology Advisory Board could assist Bonita Springs government by evaluating different fields of technological interest including Environmental Technology, Transportation Technology, Communications Technology, and the originally identified area of Information Technology. The Technology Advisory Board is a standing committee of the City Council, supporting advisory needs of the City Manager and city departments as required.

The Technology Advisory Board assists the City by recommending and evaluating the technologies that City Council deems to be of potential benefit to the City, it's residents, businesses and visitors. From time to time, the committee formulates recommendations to improve the City of Bonita Springs operations both internally for its workforce, and externally for its residents.

A primary objective of the Technology Advisory Board includes interacting on behalf of the City with various other agencies and groups in order to make recommendations as to the most effective uses of all available technologies for the benefit of internal government operations, as well as for the benefit of the community at large. When it became apparent that COVID-19 would be a longer-term challenge than anticipated, the committee devoted itself to researching resources to help residents with internet discounts, electrical and utilities assistance, and computer/technology solutions for children and students.



More recently, the committee has been exploring the growing electric vehicle industry by researching the benefits of these vehicles and the logistics and requirements of charging stations. They are hoping to identify any incentives and/or barriers that may exist as part of their evaluation in the event our city is a good candidate for this technology.

VETERANS ADVISORY BOARD

City Council has agreed to allow for the dedication of one of the city's bridges. At the September 2021 Veteran's Advisory Board meeting, the Committee discussed the dedication of one of the city's bridges to honor the men and women that have served in the United States Armed Forces. The committee proposed to dedicate the bridge located in downtown Bonita Springs on Old 41 Road as the "Veterans Memorial Bridge" with two road signs, placed at the north and south end of the bridge. Two metal plaques will be affixed to the north and south end of the bridge for pedestrians view.

The official announcement of the newly named bridge will take place at the Veterans Day event on November 11th at Riverside Park.





Did You Know.....

The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program

(LIHEAP) is a federally funded program that helps assist income -qualified families with home heating and cooling costs. The program manages costs associated with home energy bills, energy crises, weatherization and energy-related minor home repairs. LIHEAP can help families stay warm in the winter and cool in the summer through programs that reduce the risk of health and safety problems that arise from unsafe heating and cooling practices.




Councilman Forbes Recognized as a Citizen Architect, Class of 2020

The Council has approved adopting a resolution to continue a bike route system created by the U.S. Bicycle Route System (USBRS) through the Bonita Springs area. The USBRS is a developing national network of bicycle routes to facilitate bicycle travel on appropriate roads, paths, and highways and to provide connectivity between rural and urban communities. The USBRS currently encompasses 14,000 miles in 31 states and will be over 50,000 miles upon completion.

Adventure Cycling Association is currently proposing to extend U.S. Bike Route 15 by 496 miles from Madison, Florida through

Southwest Florida (Polk, Hardee, DeSoto, Charlotte, Lee, and Collier Counties) and continuing into Miami. The section of the proposed alignment that is under the City's jurisdiction consists of a one-mile segment of Imperial Parkway from East Terry Street to Bonita Beach Road.

The proposed alignment of U.S. Bike Route 15 has received local input from City staff, the City of Bonita Springs Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety Advisory Committee, and the Lee County MPO Bicycle Pedestrian Coordinating Committee (BPCC), all of whom agree that the proposed alignment is safest and allows visiting cyclists a means of existing access to and through the city. The proposed route to extend U.S. Bike Route 15 through Bonita Springs will provide a benefit to the City's residents and businesses with no associated costs to the city.
