Did you know? At one time, Memorial Day and Veteran's Day services were offered by the American Legion and the services were held at the old cemetery in Bonita Springs. There were twenty Veteran's Burial Flags for deceased Veterans that had been donated by families to the Legion and were part of these ceremonies. When the new park was built in downtown Bonita Springs, the City offered to host the ceremonies there. At that time, the Aisle of Flags was increased to one hundred flags, with additional flags donated by family members of Veterans. The flags are stored at the American Legion and brought out each Memorial and Veterans Day for display. If a flag becomes unserviceable or a family member asks for their flag back, an opening is created and another flag can be added.

About Bonita Springs Water Conservation Ordinance 21-07

The City of Bonita Springs supplements the provisions of Chapter 40E-24, Florida Administrative Code, as follows: Landscape irrigation shall be prohibited daily between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

Watering Options, Landscape Irrigation Users may irrigate only two days as specified.

When can I water the lawn in Bonita Springs?

 Odd-numbered street address may water lawns and landscapes on Wednesdays and Saturdays only, midnight until 9 a.m. or after 5 p.m. until midnight.

 Even-numbered street address no street address or those that irrigate both even and odd addresses within the same zones, which may include multi-family units and homeowners associations, may water lawns and landscapes on Thursdays and Sundays only, midnight until 9 a.m. or after 5 p.m. until midnight.

When can I water my newly planted landscaping and sod?

On the day of installation without regard to the listed day or time. Irrigation of the sod immediately prior to installation without regard to the listed day or time.

1 to 30 days: On any day of the week except Friday.

31 to 90 days: On any day of the week except Tuesday, Friday or Sunday.

Irrigation of new landscaping is limited to areas only containing the new landscaping.

An entire zone of an irrigation system shall only be utilized for landscape irrigation under this Subsection if the zone contains at least 50% new landscaping.

If a zone contains less than 50% new landscaping, or if the new landscaping is in an area that will not typically be irrigated by an irrigation system, only the individual new plantings are eligible for additional irrigation.

Targeted watering may be accomplished by low volume hand watering or any appropriate method which isolates and waters only the new landscaping.

These rules permit new landscape watering only. Homeowners should keep documentation on any new landscaping, such as a dated receipt of purchase, in case they are required to provide proof of the installation date.



The daily operation of the city is handled by the city manager and city staff.





COMMITTEE SPOTLIGHT: TREE ADVISORY BOARD

Did you know that Bonita Springs is designated as a *Tree City* by the Arbor Day Foundation?

Less than <u>one-in-five cities</u> across the U.S. share this honor. The City realizes the importance of trees to our community, our world, and our lives. The City's Tree Advisory Board works to keep the City of Bonita Springs a Tree City USA.

The board also:

- **Protects local heritage trees** such as live oak, banyan trees, and slash pines not only for history and longevity, but for how they positively impact ecosystems.
- **Reviews land development and zoning sites** prior to redevelopment to ensure heritage trees are protected and preserved.
- Works to **inform the public** about native plants that are healthy for our community and invasive exotics that should be avoided, as well as good pruning practices.
- **Sponsors a Poster contest** where local students from kindergarten through 8th grade participate in honoring trees. This year's theme was "Trees are Terrific!"
- Recommends **municipal code updates** to ensure that Trees are planted and preserved in a thoughtful and efficient manner.

Holds a Tree of the Season award program to recognize citizens with a spectacular tree. Information about this contest can be found on the next page. It is an ongoing program so all submissions welcome!

The Tree Advisory Board meetings are open to the public and typically held the 2nd Monday of each month at 4 pm at City Hall. Please plan to join a meeting. Visit the <u>City's website</u> for updates.










City of Bonita Springs Redistricting Process



The City's charter provides that, following each decennial census, the City Council may redivide the City into six City Council districts with as roughly equal in population as practical according to population estimates. Following the 2020 U.S. Census, the City engaged professional consultant Kurt Spitzer of Kurt Spitzer & Associates to assist the City in its redistricting process by analyzing census data and creating alternative district maps based upon enumerated criteria in accordance with state and federal laws. The public was invited to take part in the process. On April 6, 2022, the City Council adopted the above map depicting the adjusted City Council districts.

Did You Know.....

City Council Approved an Interlocal Agreement with Lee Tran — At the April 20th, 2022, meeting the City of Bonita Springs City Council received a presentation updating them about the Lee Tran ULTRA curb -to-curb bus service in Bonita Springs. At this meeting, City Council also approved an additional contribution to the project to assist Lee Tran with offsetting expenses. This contribution will also be used to provide a third bus for the peak hours of service for the program.

City Staff was Presented with a Certificate of Achievement for Financial Reporting- The Bonita Springs' Finance Department was presented with a Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting from the Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada (GFOA). This certificate was in response to the City of Bonita Springs' annual comprehensive financial report for the fiscal year that ended September 30, 2020. March 14-18, 2022 was recognized as Florida Government Financial Week in the City of Bonita Springs through proclamation.

City Council Approves Sub-Recipient Agreement with Lee County for CDBG-CV Entitlement Funds -Bonita Springs City Council approved Sub-Recipient agreement with Lee County for Community Development Block Grant – COVID (CDBG-CV) entitlement funds. Per Council's direction, the city will partner with local food banks to provide funding for food insecurity assistance. Once the agreement has been executed, city staff will advertise for local non-profit food pantries serving Bonita Springs to apply for funding.

What a wonderful job the **Bonita Springs Veteran's Advisory Board** does to honor and remember our Veterans! They plan and coordinate both a Memorial Day (Monday, May 30th) and Veteran's Day Service (Friday, November 11th), each year. The committee also assists Veterans in need however they are able. This past year, the Board worked to dedicate the bridge located in downtown Bonita Springs on Old 41 Rd. as the "Veterans Memorial Bridge". Two road signs were installed, placed at the north and south end of the bridge for pedestrian's to view. They also install the bricks and maintain the Veteran's

Memorial Walkway at Riverside Park, a path surrounding the park that features memorial bricks honoring our Veterans. Click on this <u>video</u> to see more information about the program.
