#### Hurricane Ian Progress Report

On September 28, 2022, Hurricane Ian made landfall as a direct hit to Lee County as a Category 5 storm. It was the largest hurricane to make landfall here and is the fifth largest storm in U.S. history. The City of Bonita Springs experienced over 12+ feet of storm surge and sustained winds of over 155 mph. Hurricane Ian impacted all City parks, our beaches, and various City-owned infrastructure. We've provided a snapshot below of the damage and permits issued through April, 2023.

**Did You Know**? Governor DeSantis has signed tax-cut package HB 7063. This package includes two sales tax holidays for disaster preparedness items, one running from May 27-June 9, 2023 and the second from Aug. 26-Sept. 8, 2023. Some examples of tax-free items include: flashlights and lanterns costing \$40 or less; reusable ice costing \$20 or less; radios costing \$50 or less; tarps and ground anchors or tie down kits costing \$100 or less; coolers and portable power banks costing \$60 or less; batteries and fuel tanks costing \$50 or less; smoke detectors, fire extinguishers, and carbon monoxide detectors costing \$70 or less; and generators costing \$3,000 or less.

The holiday also includes a number of items related to the safe evacuation of household pets. Common household consumable items that may helpful with disaster cleanup are also included. For example, laundry detergent, toilet paper and paper towels, soap, sunscreen, and various household cleaning products, with a sales price of \$30 or less.

#### **Imperial Shores Boulevard Update**

Construction on this project began in the late summer of 2022 and is expected to conclude this summer. The entirety of the project will stretch 0.3 miles along the eastern side of Imperial Shores Boulevard; beginning at Bonita Beach Road and terminating at Tarpon Avenue. Details of the project include drainage, an eight-foot-wide sidewalk and curb and guttering separated by a two-foot section of grass. The completion of this project will add an essential connection to the city's sidewalk network.





#### About the Veterans Memorial Monument seen on the cover

Originally unveiled on Veterans Day in 2012, the Veteran's Monument was a collaboration between the Veterans Committee and the Art in Public Places Board. The monument was designed by Artist Mike Morgan and plans to have it installed began in 2009. The Veteran's Committee raised funds to commission the monument by introducing the Riverside Park Veterans Memorial Walkway with bricks for purchase and by soliciting donations from businesses and private donors.

The monument pays tribute to and honors all Veterans. The etching on the front refers to the concept of "Buddies—No One Left Behind" as the theme of the piece. Unfortunately, the monument sustained damage as a result of Hurricane Irma in 2017. The City prioritized it's repair and it stands today at Riverside Park with the message just as strong and meaningful as originally intended. It is so nice to see how the City of Bonita Springs values it's Veterans!





### Did You Know.....

City Council has approved the award of the Old 41 Road and Strike Lane Signalization and Sidewalk Improvements Project to Coastal Concrete. This project involves the furnishing and installation of traffic signals and pedestrian signals at the intersection of Old 41 Road and Strike Lane. In addition, the construction of sidewalks on both sides of Strike Lane from the intersection with Old 41 Road to the railroad right-of-way, approximately 400 ft. east of Old 41 Road, will be completed.

The 2023 Sea Turtle Nesting Season started on May 1st and runs through October 31st . The Sea Turtle Ordinance is in effect from 9PM to 7AM during this period. There are guidelines you should follow to make sure this nesting season is a safe one for our marine wildlife and more information can be found here <u>Sea Turtle Nesting Season</u>.


The City of Bonita Springs is seeking volunteers to serve on various advisory boards and committees that have been established to assist the City Council on a number of civic issues. Terms of service on these committees vary. There are currently vacancies on the following boards: Art in Public Places, Special Events Committee, Tree Advisory Board, Technology Advisory Board, Veteran's Advisory Board, Historic Preservation Board, and the Outreach Committee. Riverside Park will be hydroseeded the week of May 29th. For at least two weeks, no one should walk on the grass which will be heavily irrigated during this time. The park will be roped off to discourage walking on the green area so the seed has a chance to grow.

You can purchase annual state park passes at Koreshan State Park—open 8 a to sundown each day. An individual park pass is \$60.00 and additional guests can join you for only \$2 each at most state parks.
